Non-Medicare retiree medical coverage continues to be provided by the City of Phoenix for its retirees and for non-Medicare dependents of Medicare-eligible retirees. Medical plans remain the same: Cigna HMO, BCBS PPO and BCBS Savers Choice Plan. Deductibles, coinsurance, co-pays and coverage do not change in 2018. Provider networks remain the same.

Actuaries determined that the premium increase for 2018 should be 23.4% based on plan utilization and experience. This is an improvement from the 2017 actuarially determined increase, but higher than retirees can afford. For that reason, the Retiree Rate Stabilization Fund will reduce this increase by 11.5% and the Health Care Benefits Trust will reduce it by an additional 3.5% to result in a **rate increase to retirees of 8.4% in 2018.** 

After the Retiree Rate Stabilization Fund is reduced by this 11.5%, a balance of \$7 million remains in the Fund for future City-sponsored medical plan rate adjustments as needed and approved by the Health Care Benefits Trust Board.

Retiree utilization and experience is trending more positively so far in 2017. Alternatives for medical coverage continue to be reviewed for non-Medicare retirees and dependents as we begin thinking about retiree coverage in 2019 and beyond.

Non-Medicare retirees are encouraged to attend the next General Membership Meeting that is scheduled for September 21 at 1:30 pm at the Washington Activity Center located at 2240 W. Citrus Way, Phoenix. AZ.

# President's Message

It seems that every year that passes, time goes faster. Here it is September and we are on the downside of our summer. I'm not trying to kid anyone that we don't still have another month of hot weather, but other things are changing. We are back to our regular year schedule. Our summer hiatus is behind us.

With business as usual starting again, we will finish the calendar year with our meeting on Health Care, scheduled on September 21<sup>st</sup> and our Holiday & Annual Meeting on December 8<sup>th</sup>. As a reminder, the City will be providing a Health Care option in 2018 for ONLY the pre-Medicare retirees and their dependents. Our efforts to join with the State with an option for all City Retirees could not be accomplished for 2018. We will again attempt to bring this about for 2019.

Throughout the summer, we worked with the City to set 2018 rates for the continuation of health care benefits for pre-Medicare retirees. Medical plans remain the same with Cigna HMO, BCBS PPO, and the BCBS Savers Choice Plan as options. Deductibles, coinsurance, co-pays and coverage do not change. The current networks continue to be the same. What does change, of course, is the cost of coverage. Actuaries for the City determined that the increase, based on utilization should be 23.4%. By negotiations through the Health Care Task Force with approval by the Health Care Benefits Trust Board, the increase was reduced to 8.4%. This was accomplished by using the Rate Stabilization Fund to reduce the increase by 11.5%. Additionally, we utilized the Health Care Benefits Trust to reduce it by another 3.5%, for a total rate reduction of 15%.

Those not eligible for the City pre-Medicare Retiree health insurance will need to continue to utilize other sources for another year. Any changes in rates or plan design can be addressed directly with your insurance provider, broker, or Willis Towers Watson's One Exchange. Those pre-Medicare Retirees, who have chosen to get their healthcare from other sources in the past, will again have the choice to take part in the City healthcare option during open enrollment or continue with other market options. Look for your City of Phoenix Benefits Guide that will be coming to you in the mail. Read it and keep it as a resource throughout the year. It will answer all your questions. <a href="It is an invaluable resource so do not throw it away!">It is an invaluable resource so do not throw it away!</a>

The City will continue to offer a Dental Plan for Retirees. As this is being written, the plan design and rates have not yet been finalized. More information about it will be available at the upcoming General Meeting and in the Benefits Guide that you will be receiving.

If you would like to hear more details about health and dental care and have all your questions answered, plan to attend our COPRA General Meeting, 1:30 at the Washington Adult Center, 2240 W Citrus Way on Thursday, September 21, 2017. See you there!

In May of this year, Phoenix was named the top overall performing city in the first-ever Equipt to Innovate Survey. This was a new initiative spearheaded by Governing, a magazine that covers local and

state politics, and Living Cities, a collection of leading foundations and banks with a mission of collective philanthropy. The survey was launched by Governing and Living Cities to define and measure high-performing governments, to establish a basis for growth among local governments, and to encourage localities to think innovatively. Many of you worked for the city 25 years ago when we won the Bertelsmann Award for best-run city in the world.

Approximately 60 cities were involved in the study which measured the competence of cities by seven elements:

- Dynamically Planned
- Broadly Partnered
- Resident-Involved
- Race Informed
- Smartly Resourced
- Employee-Engaged
- Data-Driven

Phoenix was specifically recognized as a leader in partnerships, particularly in cross-sector initiatives, and the city was also ranked highly in the race-informed category for taking steps to improve diversity and training employees on racial injustice. This is a great recognition of the work we do well, and with that said, we cannot relax our efforts. It is important we continue providing great service by working smarter, saving money, and being kind to our customers.

The heat of the summer is slowly passing and I hope you have been able to stay cool. We are moving to our cooler season and will be able to once again enjoy outside activities. # **ECHRIS UPDATE**

Coming soon, the eCHRIS system will be upgraded and will allow users to navigate within the application with more ease. Effective September 5, the application login page and the initial homepage for employees will look different. The homepage will include Employee Self-Service functions and users will see tiles representing some of the more commonly used features, including viewing their paycheck, viewing their PMGs, and submitting leave requests.

The new version is mobile friendly and will allow employees to access eCHRIS functions on their phone or tablet *without an app* to install. Employees will be able to manage leave requests and view paychecks from their mobile device. More cool features are soon to come, including accident reporting, employee onboarding, and online organizational charts.

On September 5, you can access the enhanced eCHRIS system at <a href="https://hcmprod.phoenix.gov">hcmprod.phoenix.gov</a> or by the same way as you always have, at <a href="https://linkingline.gov">InsidePHX</a> and through the <a href="https://hcmprod.phoenix.gov">HR Connection website</a>.

Please note the eCHRIS system will be unavailable during the upgrade process which is occurring over Labor Day weekend.
